Lactic Acid Jelly (Cooper)

DESCRIPTION

GELÁKTA is a harmless, non-irritating, vaginal antiseptic and prophylactic in jelly form, which is a highly satisfactory method of applying curative medicines to the vagina and the neck of the womb. Its consistency insures an even distribution and prolonged contact with every part of the vaginal tract. It is more sanitary and convenient than are douches, tablets, capsules or suppositories, which it entirely supplants. GELÁKTA is colorless, therefore does not stain; it is non-poisonous, odorless, non-greasy and water-soluble.

**NOTE—The name GELÁKTA is now used instead of our former name LACTAGEL, which resembled other names and caused confusion. GELÁKTA completely avoids this.*

DIRECTIONS

GELÁKTA should be ordered *with* or *without* the approved sanitary glass nozzle. When the jelly is used alone, *the nozzle is required*. When it is prescribed with the RAMSES Vaginal Diaphragm, *no nozzle is needed*, a little of the jelly being applied to the rim of the diaphragm as a lubricant, and a half teaspoonful or so placed in the dome.

When GELÁKTA is used alone, screw the glass nozzle in its place. Apply the key to the bottom of the tube and turn until the nozzle is full of GELÁKTA to its tip. While lying on the back, insert the nozzle downward and backward into the vagina about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Turn the key $\frac{1}{3}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ turn, thus depositing about a teaspoonful of jelly. Then withdraw the

DESCRIPTION

GELÁKTA should be ordered **with** or **without** the approved sanitary glass nozzle applicator. When the jelly is used alone, **the nozzle is required**. When it is prescribed with our Ramses Transparent Vaginal Diaphragm, **no nozzle is needed**, a little of the jelly being applied to the rim of the diaphragm as a lubricant, and a half teaspoonful placed in the dome.

GÉLAQUIN

Lactic Acid Jelly (Cooper) + With Oxyquinolin-Sulphate

DESCRIPTION

GÉLAQUIN is a harmless, non-irritating, acidic and especially effective vaginal antiseptic and prophylactic in jelly form, which is a highly satisfactory method of applying curative medicines to the vagina and the neck of the womb. It has the same base, formula, and physical consistency as our GELAKTA (Lactic Acid Jelly—Cooper), with the addition of Oxyquinolin-Sulphate. Its consistency insures an even distribution and prolonged contact with every part of the vaginal tract. It is more sanitary and convenient than are douches, tablets, capsules or suppositories, which it entirely supplants. GÉLAQUIN does not stain and is non-poisonous, non-greasy and water-soluble.

DIRECTIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS

GÉLAQUIN should be ordered *with or without* the approved sanitary glass nozzle. When the jelly is used alone, *the nozzle is required*. (In cases where it is prescribed with the Ramses Transparent Vaginal Diaphragm, *no nozzle is needed*, a little of the jelly being applied to the rim of the diaphragm as a lubricant, and a half teaspoonful or so placed in or on the dome).

When GÉLAQUIN is used alone, screw the glass nozzle in its place. Apply the key to the bottom of the tube and turn until the nozzle is full of GÉLAQUIN to its tip. While lying on the back, insert the nozzle downward and backward into the vagina about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Turn the key $\frac{1}{3}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ turn, thus depositing about a teaspoonful of jelly. Then withdraw the

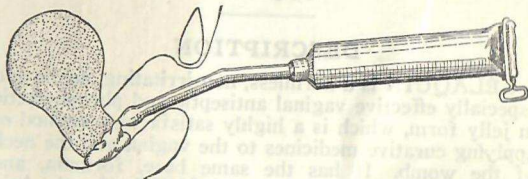
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nozzle. A single application will be effective for about 3 hours. When the tube is empty, the nozzle (still full of jelly) may be attached to a new tube.

No douching is necessary after the use of GÉLAQUIN; but some patients may wish to syringe themselves in addition. There is no objection to this; but *it should in no case be done prior to 3 hours after applying*, and it is better if deferred until next morning, assuming that the jelly was used on retiring.

After withdrawing and again just before using, the nozzle should be thoroughly wiped with a clean cloth, or it may be washed if desired. It is best to leave the

nozzle attached to the tube. When not in use, the small rubber protective cap should be placed on the tip of the glass nozzle to keep the contents clean; and the entire outfit should be placed in a box or other receptacle to protect it. Cleanliness is most important.

NOTE—We also manufacture GELAKTA, (Lactic Acid Jelly—Cooper), a harmless, non-irritating Vaginal Jelly used as an alternative for GÉLAQUIN especially where a Jelly is prescribed for use with the Ramses Vaginal Diaphragm, which must be properly fitted by the physician. GELAKTA has the same base and physical consistency as GÉLAQUIN, and is non-poisonous, non-greasy and water-soluble.
